*Scheme (including Appointment  
of Trustees).*

SCHEME MADE BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION UNDER THE CHARITABLE TRUSTS ACTS,  
1853 TO 1925, IN THE MATTER OF THE HODGSON EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION.

*The Foundation.*

1. In this Scheme the expression "the Foundation" means the HODGSON EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION, in the Parish of Dent, in the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire, comprising the educational endowment, as determined by an Order made by the Charity Commissioners on 2 February 1904, of the Charity of Roger Hodgson, founded by Deed of 4 May 1805.

*Administration.*

2. The Foundation and its endowment (including the particulars specified in the Schedule to this Scheme) shall be administered in conformity with the provisions of this Scheme by the Governors for the time being of the Free Grammar School Foundation of King James at Dent, acting in accordance with the procedure prescribed by the Scheme of the Board of Education of 30 December 1921 now regulating that Foundation; or any substituted provisions, as Trustees of the Foundation.

*Declaration by Trustees.*

3. No person shall be entitled to act as a Trustee, whether on a first or any subsequent entry into office, until he has signed a declaration of acceptance and of willingness to act in the trusts of this Scheme.

*Trustees not to be personally interested in the Foundation.*

4. Except in special circumstances, with the approval in writing of the Board of Education, no Trustee shall take or hold any interest in any property belonging to the Foundation, otherwise than as a trustee for the purposes thereof, or receive any remuneration, or be interested in the supply of work or goods, at the cost of the Foundation.

*Application of Income.*

5.—(1) After payment of any expenses of administration, the net income of the Foundation shall be applied by the Trustees in one or both of the following ways:—

(a) In assisting pupils to attend schools, institutions, or classes for purposes of education other than elementary, by paying their fees or travelling or other incidental expenses, or by providing them with maintenance allowances; provided that candidates for these benefits shall be boys or girls resident in the Parish of Dent who, in the opinion of the Trustees, are in need of financial assistance.

(b) In otherwise promoting the education, including social and physical training, of boys and girls of the poorer classes in the said Parish.

(2) The Trustees shall consult the Local Education Authority as to their general action under this clause and, if occasion requires, as to the educational qualifications of candidates for benefit.

6. Within the limits prescribed by this Scheme the Trustees shall have full power to make rules for the management of the Foundation, and for the conduct of their business, including the summoning and chairmanship of meetings, the deposit of money at a proper bank, the custody of documents, and the appointment as Clerk or Secretary (to hold office at their pleasure) of one of themselves without salary or some other fit person at such salary, if any, as may be approved by the Board of Education.

*Minutes and Accounts.*

7. The Trustees shall provide and keep a minute book and books of account. All proper accounts in relation to the Foundation shall in each year be made out and certified in such form as the Board of Education may require, and copies sent to the Board and to the Local Education Authority.

*Vesting Property.*

8. The Trustees and all other persons capable of being bound by this Scheme shall, unless the Board of Education otherwise in writing direct, do all such acts as may be necessary in order to vest in the Official Trustee of Charity Lands and to transfer to the Official Trustees of Charitable Funds respectively, or to vest in and transfer to the Official Trustee or Trustees of Educational Trust Property when constituted, all freehold and leasehold lands and hereditaments and all stocks, shares, funds and securities respectively, at any time belonging to the Foundation.

*Surplus Cash.*

9. Any sum of cash at any time belonging to the Foundation and not needed as a balance for working purposes shall (unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Education) be treated as capital and invested

*Questions under Scheme.*

10. Any question as to the construction of this Scheme, or as to the regularity or the validity of any acts done or about to be done under this Scheme, shall be determined conclusively by the Board of Education, upon such application made to them for the purpose as they think sufficient.

*Interpretation.*

11. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Scheme as it applies to an Act of Parliament.

*Date of Scheme.*

12. The date of this Scheme shall be the day on which it is established by an Order of the Board of Education.
